

RECOMMENDATIONS

Applicants for a Teacher Training Award are required to submit the names of 3 individuals from whom the Committee will request confidential letters of recommendation. Recommendations will be sent directly to the Scholarship Committee.

The first shall be from the Principal of a Judaic Department of the Jewish Day or High School or from a Professor of Jewish Studies at university;

The second shall be from the Rabbi or spiritual leader most familiar with the applicant's background and ability;

The third shall be from a senior teacher able to attest to the applicants having successfully maintained a rigorous academic programme at high school and/or university. Relatives should not be given as references.

PAYMENT OF SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS

Successful applicants will receive half the award in January upon receipt of confirmation from the school that the student is properly enrolled and attending classes. Confirmation must also be received from the School outlining courses being taken. The balance will be awarded at the end of the school term, upon receipt of confirmation from the school that the student successfully completed the school year. A transcript indicating courses of study and final grades must be submitted.

PUBLICITY

Scholarship Awards winners will be expected to allow the use of their photographs and names in any publicity which the Awards Committee shall see fit to release to the Anglo-Jewish press or other media in Canada.

Scholarship Programme for Students Planning Careers in Jewish Education and Higher Jewish Studies

FOREWORD

The school has limited funds to assist its graduates who wish to pursue post-secondary Judaic Studies in Israel. This brochure outlines two separate programmes, one designed for **teacher training** and the other for those with **other career plans**.

To be eligible for either programme, candidates must:

1. Be graduates of Associated Hebrew Schools Middle School and have attended Associated for at least two years;
2. Propose to enroll in a full year programme in Israel, which is approved by the Scholarship Committee of Associated Hebrew Schools of Toronto.

In making these awards, the Committee will consider such factors as:

- the academic record of the candidate
- the financial need of the candidate
- the reputation of the institution the candidate proposes to attend, including the extent to which its approach to Judaic Studies is compatible with the Zionist philosophy of this School.

Awards are for one year only. The Committee will entertain applications for renewal. Payment of awards and renewal of awards will be conditional on receipt of satisfactory evidence that the candidate has successfully completed the programme for which the award was made.

TEACHER TRAINING AWARDS

Scholarships may be awarded to candidates who plan a career in Hebrew Studies teaching at Associated Hebrew Schools and who are enrolled in an approved programme in Israel. A sub-committee of the Scholarship Committee will interview candidates.

While the School makes no commitment to employ the award winners on graduation, the candidate must make a commitment to teach Hebrew Studies for at least two years at Associated, should they be offered a position.

Some portion of the Award may be in the form of a forgivable loan, conditional on the award winner fulfilling her or his commitment to teach at Associated after graduation.

POST-SECONDARY JUDAIC STUDIES

These awards are intended for students who do not intend to prepare for careers as Judaic Studies educators at Associated. They are applicable for study in approved schools and Universities in Israel. A candidate may be eligible provided her or his programme of studies includes a significant Judaic Studies component and/or the major course of studies is "Judaic", at the approved institution. The programme may also include secular subjects.

For students pursuing post secondary Judaic Studies, a Scholarship Award may be given.

DEADLINE FOR APPLICATION

All submissions for scholarship assistance or renewals of scholarships should be made by **March 31** and be fully completed in the year preceding the planned programme of studies for which the applicant seeks assistance. Notice of the scholarship grant will be forthcoming normally no later than May 31 of the same year.

LATE APPLICATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.

APPLICATION REQUESTS

Requests for scholarship consideration must be made by application available from the Scholarship Committee. Most recent transcripts from high school, yeshiva, university and/or college must accompany applications. The Committee may request other records.
